Dacepton[®] (Apomorphine) is NOT a Narcotic/Morphine. It does NOT contain any analgesic properties what so ever. It is NOT addictive. It should not be stopped without the supervision of a Parkinson's Specialist.

D-mine[®] Care Nurse Visit Protocol

When your specialist decides Dacepton[®] is an appropriate treatment option for you they may refer you into the D-mine[®] Care Support Programme provided by Ever Pharma UK. Our philosophy is *Working in Partnership with the NHS* to provide a patient centred service for those people with Parkinson's on a Dacepton[®] Infusion.

The service offers additional support to you from our team of specialist D-mine[®] care nurse advisors. They will provide follow up visits while you are on treatment. You will also have access to the D-mine[®] Care Support Line, Monday-Friday, 9am-5pm and the 24 hour D-mine[®] Care Technical Help Line.

The below visit schedule may change according to your needs. For patients who are new on infusion, we aim to provide fortnightly contact with home visits or phone calls over the first three months and then approximately three monthly for the first year. Visits may be less frequent if you've been on Apomorphine prior to starting Dacepton[®].
